










Public vs Private Hospital Beds




Korean Hospital Enlargement Change

- Equity of access to healthcare services, High level of consumer's choice



Advanced Healthcare System

- efficiency and equity.
 - The whole population is covered by the national health insurance scheme.
 - Foreign expatriates are covered by the national insurance
 - Very short waiting time
- National Hospital Evaluation Program in place
 - Service quality of hospitals is managed by the government






□ Health care Resources

- Large pool of healthcare providers (2008)
 - 52,283 Medical Institutions (450,119 beds)
 - 160 Public hospitals (13% of total hospitals)

- High portion of specialists, accounting for 62 percent of total number 57,000 of doctors (91,000 persons)

- High number of diagnostic devices in use (2006)*
 - # of CT Scanner / 1 million population: 33.7 (UK 7.6, US 33.9)
 - # of MRI / 1 million population: 13.6 (UK 5.6, Canada 6.2, US 26.5)
- The most advanced technology in place
 - Paperless hospitals have become the standard with PACS and EMR(EHR)
 - State-of-the-art radio-therapeutic devices such as Proton Therapy,
 Cyberknife, Gammaknife and Tomotherapy for cancer treatment
 - Leading Asia in Robotic Surgery



□ Proton Therapy Center



- Installed in only 29 hospitals worldwide
- \$15,000~20,000 in Korea vs\$60,000~75,000 in USA

□ Radio-Surgery

- Cybe-Knife/Gamma Knife

 \$18,000~20,000 in Korea vs

World-class healthcare services provided

- Level of medical technology in Korea is 80~90% of that in the US
- Some specialties are recognized as the top class in the world
 - Oncology, Cardiovascular disease, Plastic Surgery, Dentistry, Alternative Medicine, etc.
- Even US doctors come to Korea for training in such specialties as Living Donor Liver Transplantation and Robotic Surgery


Robotic Surgery

- Total 26 da Vinci Surgical Systems in place
- 1 leading hospital equipped with 5 da Vinci
 - → more than 2,000 cases done





- Organ Transplantation
 - Number of Organ Transplantation Cases in 2008
 - 1,515 Cases from Living Donor
 : Kidney, Liver, Pancreas, Bone-Marrow
- 2,284 Cases for Brain Death Donor Cases (9 organs)




- Direct Flights from North America and Europe

- For cosmetic procedures and Traditional Korean Medicine






National Strategy for Medical Travel
